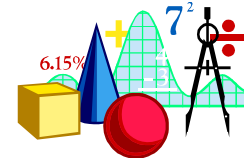

- ◆ Perception of being backward looking and old fashioned



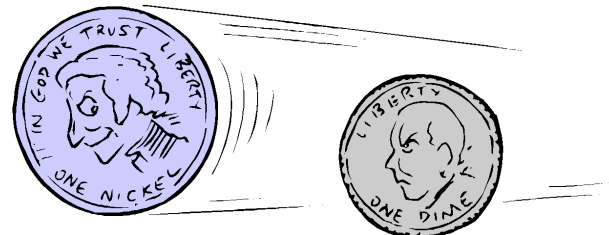
# PENSIONS

- ◆ Employers acting as facilitators not sponsors



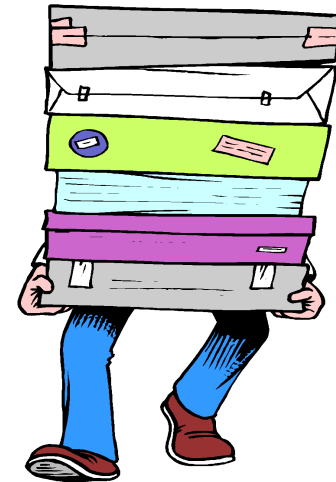
# SOCIAL POLICY BOARD
